

NOTICE TO PATRONS

(Patron ID System)

The Patron Identification (ID) System used in this premises allows us to examine and record the actual identification produced by patrons on entry to the venue in order for the premises to fulfil its functions and responsibilities pursuant to Sections 155 (Minors on Premises), and Section 156 (Supply of Liquor to Minors, Unduly Intoxicated and Disorderly Persons)



This system does not scan or extract information from the documents examined for comparison with other information sources or store your information on any form of external data base.

The information is stored on the premises central CCTV system only, and can not be compromised through hacking, computer theft or other inappropriate accesses.

All information gathered on this system is done so in the course of administration of the Liquor Act 1992 and therefore patrons' confidentiality is protected by Section 48(1) that imposes a maximum penalty of \$3500 for any person who directly or indirectly discloses such information gathered.

The Patron ID System is one of many initiatives this premises has taken to maintain the premises obligations with respect to providing a safe environment for patrons and staff of the premises. This initiative also provides the premises with the ability to defend against possible prosecution where minors have gained access to the premises after showing false and misleading documents on entry, indicating that a person had attained 18 years. (Section 230 of The Liquor Act 1992)

This premise has taken all precautions to comply with the requirements of the Privacy Act 1988 and has ensured a privacy policy is in place to protect our patron's privacy. This information is stored securely on the central CCTV system and only retained for as long as necessary, consistent with the collection purpose.

Any information gathered from this system will only be released to an authorised investigator in response to a Written Notice issued pursuant to Section 178 the Liquor Act 1992 or a police officer exercising authority pursuant to the Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000

Patrons are reminded that this information is required in compliance with a lawful process requiring production of documents and/or for the purposes of the Liquor Act 1992. Should patrons refuse to have their identification documents thoroughly examined in this way when required to do so, they will be refused entry to the premises.
